General

Arrow is a first early potato producing large, uniformly sized oval tubers with shallow eyes. It is a rather firm cooking potato, with a lovely earthy taste. It has a white flesh colour and can be cultivated on most soil types. Typically grown as a first early variety in Cornwall, Kent and Pembrokeshire.

Arrow will grow well on most soil types and especially in sandy soils. Avoid planting from cold store into cold soils. Arrow is susceptible to Metribuzin (eg. Sencorex) so do not use this herbicide.

Arrow has a short dormancy, therefore doesn't store for long periods of time

Resistance

Arrow has good resistance to Common Scab and Virus Yntn. It is susceptible to Foliage Blight but shows good resistance to Tuber Blight.
